## Countable Nouns/Common Noun have to Numbers:-

1. Singular Number
2. Plural Number

## Singular Number

A Noun is said to be singular when it shows only a single person/ one Person, Place, animal, bird, things. Let's understand with this Example, Boy means one boy.

We add a, and an before a Singular Nouns. Like A bat means one bat.

Examples - a boy, a fan, a table, a rat, a bat, a flower, a hen, a kite, a parrot, a hat, a man etc.

## Plural Number

A noun that stands for more than one person, animal, place or thing is said to be in the plural number.

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Examples - Two boys, Three birds, Four apples, Three tables, Two pens, Five chairs, Six cats.

## Singular and Plural Rules for class 2

Rule 1: Addition of ' $s$ ' to change into Plural form. (Most of the nouns take 's')

For Example : Hen - Hens, Rat- Rats, Boy- Boys, Book- Books

| A tree | Two trees |
| A book | Four books |
| An Apple | Three apple |
| An Egg | Five Umbrellas Eggs |
| An Umbrella | Thirty Students |
| A Students | Six Birds |
| A Bird | Ten Parrots |
| A parrot | Seven Rats |
| A Rat |  |

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Rule 2: Add 'es' when nouns end in- ch, $x$, $s$ and ss.

For Example : A Branch- Two branches, A class- Three classes, One Box- Two Boxes

| Brush | brushes |
| Branch | Glasses |
| Glass | Watches |
| Watch | Benches |
| Bench | beaches |
| Six | Lunches |

Rule 3 : Nouns that end in a 'vowel + $\mathrm{Y}^{\prime}$ take the letter 's'.

For Example : Day- Days

| Rule 4 : Nouns that end in a 'consonant + Y' take the letter 'ies'. |  |
| For Example : Baby - Babies |  |
| Fingular | Puppies |
| Puppy |  |

| Party | Parties |
| Army | Armies |
| Lady | Ladies |
| Enemy | Enemies |
| Country | Countries |

| Rule 5 : Noun that end in 'o' take 'es'. |  |
| For Example : Mango - Mangoes |  |
| Singular | Plural |
| Mango | Mangoes |
| Mosquito | Mosquitoes |
| Hero | Heroes |
| Tomato | Tomatoes |
| potato | Potatoes |

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| volcano | volcanoes |
| :--- | :--- |
| Veto | Vetoes |
| Torpedo | Torpedoes |
| domino | dominoes |
| echo | echoes |

Rule 6 : Some Nouns that end in 'o' take only 's'.
For Example : Photo - Photos

Rule 7 : Some nouns ending in 'o' may take both 's' or 'es'.

For Example : Buffalo - Buffalos/Buffaloes

| Singular | Plural |
| :--- | :--- |
| buffalo | buffaloes/buffalos |
| cargo | volcanos/volcanoes |
| volcano | zeros/zeroes |
| zero | banjos/banjoes |
| banjo | halos/haloes |
| halo | mangos/mangoes |
| mango | mottos/mottoes |
| motto |  |

Rule 8 : Noun that end in 'f' or 'fe' usually change the $f$ sound to $v$ and add 's ' or 'es'.

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For Example : - Thief- Thieves
